DO NOT USE A HOSE TO WASH OFF AREA!

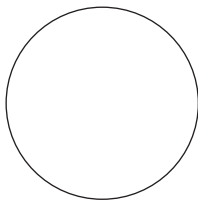

Automobile Materials

- Excessive soap or other wastes from car maintenance activities
- Oil or other automotive fluids

Tip: Limit use of soaps or go to a commercial car wash. Recycle oil and other automotive products. If spill occurs, use cat litter or sawdust to soak up fluid, then put it in the trash.

Lawn & Garden Materials

- Fertilizers, pesticides, or herbicides
- Yard wastes
- Landscaping materials

Tip: Use lawn care products sparingly. Use non-toxic alternatives.

Construction Materials

- Paints, varnishes, and solvents
- Paving materials
- Concrete
- Dirt
- Dewatering discharge
- Wash water from concrete trucks and equipment
- Concrete saw water

Tip: Stockpile or store soil on-site, not in the street or paved area. Prevent soil from washing into storm drain. Latex paint can be solidified and put in the trash. Put hardened concrete in the trash. Rinse off equipment covered in concrete onto the grass or other unpaved surface. Sweep up concrete dust from saw cuts.

Waste Materials

- Trash
- Food waste
- Oil and grease
- Liquid and solid wastes
- Animal wastes
- Mobile wash water

Tip: Contact your trash hauler for guidelines on disposal of materials. Mobile wash water should be collected and discharged to a drain inside a building.
